Franke Park Day Camp

Franke Park Day Camp provides children with enjoyable outdoor experiences that foster cooperation through learning, playing, working, problem solving, and socializing together. Campers enjoy a wide range of activities including hiking, fire building, outdoor cooking, swamp study, nature walks, arts and crafts, games, mudsliding and more! Franke Park Day Camp has been serving the children of this community with an emphasis on basic camping skills and nature education since 1946.

Any individual 4-18 years of age may register for Franke Park Day Camp, regardless of sex, color, national origin, religion, or disability. (Please see the 2023 Advanced Camper brochure when registering campers 12-18 years of age.) Due to space limitations, campers 4-12 years of age may attend only one session of camp.

All campers must be of minimum age by June 1, 2023. Campers are limited to one camp session.

Registering for more than one camp session will result in cancellation of the additional session(s) and a refund less processing fees.

LOCATION

Franke Park, 3411 Sherman Blvd.

Campers should be dropped off and picked up at the Nature Lodge in Franke Park. The day camp parking lot is located between Pavilion #2 and the playground.

AGES

Camp is open to children ages 4-11. Campers must be of minimum age by June 1, 2023. Campers are grouped by age: 4-5, 6-8, 9-11.

Come spend a week on the farm! Our Farmin' Fun Day Camp provides a stimulating, healthy and beautiful environment where you will learn about plants, animals and life on the farm. Campers will be able to continue the cycle of farm-to-table in our teaching kitchen. The camp integrates hands-on farming such as gardening and animal care, cooperative games, wagon rides, nature exploration and more for a memorable and diverse summer camp experience. You will care for farm animals; hike in the woods; play in the creek; wash, dye and felt wool from one of our sheep; enjoy hayrides around the farm and much more! Registration begins March 20. Campers are limited to one camp session. Counselors-in-Training may register for multiple camp sessions.

CAMP BUDDIES

We will do our best to place the campers together as requested, however, due to the volume of registrations and the lottery processing system, grouping is not guaranteed.

F.I.T.

"Farmers in Training" is designed to provide children ages 12 and older a more active role in the care of livestock, vegetable gardening, hands-on beekeeping, and campfire cookouts on Fridays. Farmers in Training also help harvest for the Farmers' Market on Wednesdays in addition to participating in games and other fun activities.

C.I.T.

"Counselors in Training" is for campers 13-17 years of age who have completed 2 weeks of F.I.T. Counselors in Training are role models for the younger campers. The program is designed to train youth how to be confident leaders among their peers. C.I.T.s will have opportunities to learn important teambuilding, leadership, and agriculture skills as they assist camp counselors in leading activities such as beekeeping, gardening and animal care. Each camper will be required to provide two references to complete their registration.

Camp ACTIVenture

The Botanical Conservatory's Camp ACTIVenture engages campers in active, adventurous fun! This exciting day camp incorporates off-site excursions to city and state parks, rivers, trails and other recreation destinations where campers experience northern Indiana adventures such as biking, bouldering, zip lining, kayaking, fire building, hiking, orienteering or cooling off in freshwater sources. Camp ACTIVenture integrates values exploration and nature play to foster individual accomplishment, community belonging and character development. Natural elements of earth, air, water and fire are also explored through safe, outdoor challenges that educate and thrill. Registration deadlines are one week prior to each session. Space is limited to 12 campers per week. Registration begins March 20.

LOCATION

The Foellinger-Freimann Botanical Conservatory is the basecamp of Camp ACTIVenture at 1100 S. Calhoun Street in downtown Fort Wayne, IN. Staff-led excursions to other Northeast Indiana destinations are within walking distance or a 2-hour driving range.

Designed for children 9-13 years of age. Campers must be of minimum age by June 1, 2023.

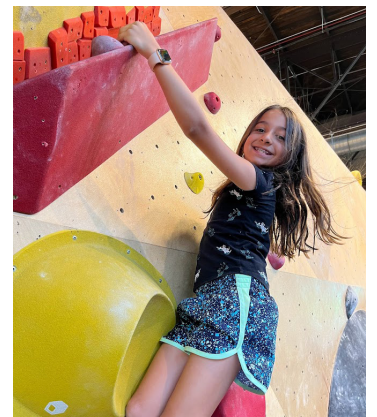
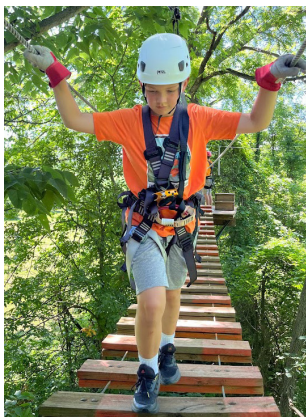

Day Camp Registration

Registration for Day Camps Begins March 20 On-Line, by Mail, Fax, Drop Box or In Person

(Exception: Kids for Nature Summer Camp registrations are handled by the Fort Wayne Children's Zoo. Registrations are being accepted NOW. Sign up online at kidszoo.org. See note below for details).

5 Easy Ways to Register

1) On-Line

Register on-line at www.fortwayneparks.org. If you do not already have a user ID and password or have forgotten them, call 427-6000 or e-mail rhonda.berg@cityoffortwayne.org. On-line registrations are processed as you register with no time delay.

2) By Mail

Complete the day camp registration form in this brochure (or a copy of it) and mail to the address above. Please use a separate registration form for each camper.

3) By Fax

FAX your completed registration form to (260) 427-6020. Available 24 hours a day.

4) Drop Box

If our office is closed, you may drop your registration in the 24-hour drop box located at the front entrance of our building at 705 E. State Blvd.

5) In Person

You may register in person at the Parks and Recreation Department, 705 E. State Blvd., (corner of State and Parnell), Monday-Friday, 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m.

We cannot accept day camp registrations over the phone.

Confirmations will be sent (by mail or e-mail) within a week of registration. If you do not receive a confirmation in this time frame, please call 427-6000.

Parks & Recreation Refund Policy

Full refunds less a processing fee of \$5 or 10% (whichever is greater) will be granted to individuals if requested before the day the camp session begins. Refunds requested less than one day prior to the start of the camp session may be granted only for illness or medical reasons. These refunds will be pro-rated and issued in the form of a credit to your account with us, which may then be applied to a future purchase. Please allow 4-6 weeks for processing refunds. Credit card refunds are credited to your account immediately.

Things to Know Before You Sign Up

- Registration for day camps opens on March 20. Registrations will be processed in the order they are received. Space is limited and placement in any given session cannot be guaranteed. If the session(s) for which you have registered is full, you will be notified by phone so you may choose another session, be placed on a waiting list or request a refund.
- On-line registrations are accepted immediately with no time delay.
- Checks should be made out to Board of Park Commissioners. If you are registering for other Parks and Recreation programs in addition to day camp, please submit a separate check for the camps.
- We accept Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express.
- Campers to be of minimum age by June 1, 2023.
- Both Franke Park Day Camp and Farmin' Fun Day Camp limit campers to one session. (Exception: CITs may register for unlimited sessions of Franke Park Day Camp and Farmin' Fun Day Camp). Campers may sign up for 2 sessions of Camp ACTI-Venture.

Youth Scholarships

The Parks & Recreation Department offers scholarships for qualified children as funds are available. Youth (18 years and younger) may apply for ONE Youth Scholarship up to \$75 to use for ONE class/camp/program (excluding Zoo camps/programs) per calendar year. To qualify for a scholarship, you must provide a letter from your child's school stating that he/she qualifies for free lunches and free textbooks. If such a letter is not available, alternative official documentation may include: (1) a copy of the applicant family's most recent IRS Tax Return form (Social Security number blacked out) or (2) an official letter from your state indicating qualification for Food Stamps. This documentation must be submitted along with your camp registration form and payment for any remaining balance above the \$75 scholarship (online registration is not available when applying for scholarship).
