

# About Lindenwood Nature Preserve

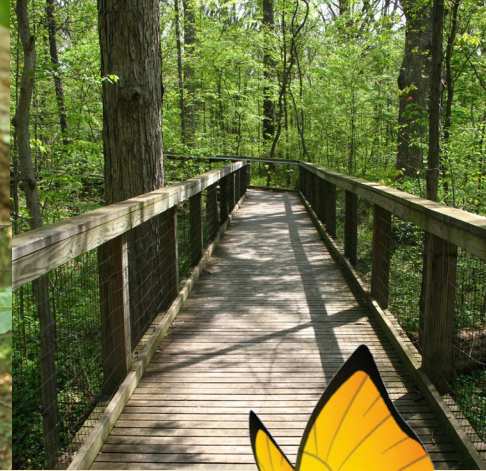
Lindenwood Nature Preserve has been a public city park since 1987 and became a dedicated nature preserve by the State of Indiana in 1994. Lindenwood encompasses 110 acres of oak-hickory forest and a small quiet two-acre pond. The Preserve is a serene place for hiking and fosters discovery and exploration.

## Our Mission

We are dedicated to protecting Indiana's natural habitat while also providing programs that promote environmental education and cultural enrichment. We believe that fostering awareness within a natural setting enhances the quality of life through exploration and discover.

## Our Educational Programs

Our environmental programs are great for all ages and we are sure to have something to peak everyone's interest. Our programs are led by our naturalist and always contain hands-on activities that allow for experiential learning. Many of our programs also meet Indiana Academic Standards set forth by the State. Programs can be scheduled May 1 through October 31.

## Fees

- 1 hour or less = \$3 / student
- 2 hours = \$6 / student
- Campfire = \$25/hour

There is a minimum group fee of \$30/hour for programs. A maximum of five teachers/chaperones may attend with each group at no charge. An adult:student ratio of 1:8 is recommended. Cash, checks and credit cards are accepted. Checks should be made out to Fort Wayne Parks and Recreation.

All programs are one hour long. Programs denoted with (\*) have both one- or two-hour options available. All programs with the exception of campfires and pond studies contain an educational hike.
